This resource provides students interested in pursuing scholarships with a list of opportunities that will help them get started. There are many additional scholarship opportunities available to students.


Tennessee State University Writing Center Scholarship Support

Tips for Writing Scholarship Essays



Mistakes to Avoid

- ✓ Misspelling words and making other grammatical errors.
- ✓ Not reading all the application instructions and/or essay prompts and instructions.
- ✓ Providing incorrect answers and/or failing to address the essay prompt.
- ✓ Giving yourself and others too little time to meet deadlines.
- ✓ Failing to check email, including spam and junk folders, for responses and messages.
- ✓ Not completing the application or writing the essay yourself

Come to the Writing Center to Get Help with Your Scholarship Essays and Drafts

- Work with a Writing Center tutor to understand scholarship prompts and brainstorm ideas
- Make an appointment with a tutor to get feedback to help you revise and develop your scholarship essay drafts
- Review the final

draft of your scholarship essays with a tutor before submitting
